
Usage Guide:

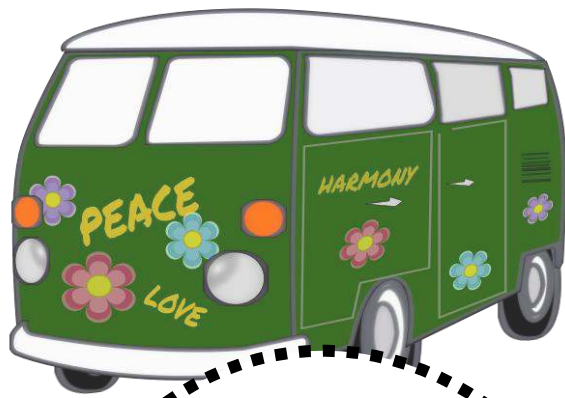

- Desegregation - A process to end separation in public areas based on race
- Sit-ins -- Protests against where blacks "sat in" segregated "white only" areas
- March on Washington - 1963 D.C. demonstration promoting a civil rights act
- Freedom Rides -- Bus trips to south to test rights against anti-segregation rules
- Nonviolence -- Protest method that avoided use of violent means even when provoked
- SNCC - Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee ("Snick")
- Earl Warren -- Chief Justice of Supreme Court; handed down many civil rights victories
- Martin Luther King Jr -- Civil rights leader with a Christian non-violence philosophy
- Malcolm X -- Civil rights leader, member of the Black Muslim faith
- James Baldwin -- Civil rights activist and author
- Civil Rights Act -- 1964 federal legislation against desegregating public accommodations
- Voting Rights Act -- 1965 federal legislation against racial discrimination in voting
- Poll tax -- A fee, often racist in nature, required to vote
- Bloody Sunday -- Violent police response to unarmed voting rights march
- Twenty-third -- Amendment providing a means for D.C. residents to vote for President
- Black Power -- Slogan supporting black self-determination
- Black Panthers -- Black power organization promoting social justice

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
